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# TOWNCOUNCIL

The Town of Knightdale has a Council-Manager form of government. Under this system the citizens elect a mayor and five council members as the Town's governing body. The Council then appoints the Town Manager who serves at the discretion of the Council. Council members are elected to four-year terms. The Mayor, as the principal elected official of the town, provides leadership to the governing body and the community, and presides over council meetings.

### **ABOUTKNIGHTDALE**

The Town celebrates the opening of its new Splash Pad in August 2019 to only keep it closed through the Summer of 2020 due to COVID-19.

Incorporated in 1927, the Town of Knightdale is located in Wake County, just seven miles east of Raleigh, the State Capital of North Carolina. It has a corporate limit comprised of 7.44 square miles and an extraterritorial jurisdiction of 17.75 square miles. With a population of only 243 in the 1930 Census, the Town's major growth started in the 1990s, and today, it is recognized as the fastest growing municipality in Wake County, the State's second largest county.

Knightdale is a dynamic, fast-growing community full of opportunity, welcoming those who want something different. It is a place citizens can call their own, where the culture is decided by the people, and a place that encourages its citizens to make the Town what they want and gives them the freedom to be themselves.

Town staff, the Mayor, and Town Council remain cautiously optimistic about the economic stability and viability of the community during the COVID-19 pandemic. Like other communities, the Town took precautionary measures to ensure the safety of its citizens. While essential workers, such as police, fire, and public works personnel, retained normal work routines, Town Hall closed and most non-essential Town staff worked remotely. Parks and other public facilities closed during the second half of the year with most cultural and recreational programming being suspended. The Town looks forward to returning to normalcy where citizens are unrestrained as they live, work, and play.





### **GROWINGECONOMY**

The Town of Knightdale's diverse economy is supported by businesses of all shapes and sizes from locally -owned shops to nationally recognized corporations. Its economy benefits from the proximity to the City of Raleigh and the Research Triangle Park, which includes Raleigh, Durham, Chapel Hill and surrounding communities. This area is considered one of the best places to live and work in the United States. Like the rest of the nation and world, Knightdale has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic that surfaced during later winter and early spring of 2020. Unemployment increased to 6.6% compared to 3.9% at the same point last year. Still, this was lower than the statewide rate of 7.7%. The median household slipped slightly to \$70,376 compared to \$70,540 previously.

### Town of Knightdale Expands Raleigh Transportation Services With New Bus Route

Knightdale has worked with *Go*Raleigh to expand bus service to residents of the Town. A revamped route now connects Knightdale to the New Hope Commons Shopping Center that allows for transfer opportunities to multiple routes. ### ECONOMICSUMMARY

The Town has seen a mixed bag in its economic situation. Knightdale's economic condition continues to experience disproportional growth. Retail trade, restaurants and accommodations dominate growth, meaning workers earn less than those in the rest of the county and state. However, with focused efforts, the Town expects to recover from COVID-related impacts and experience strong, sustainable growth. Robust housing growth coupled with relatively low prices position Knightdale's housing market as both affordable and attractive. Median home prices comparatively are lower than most communities in Wake County. The percentage of households spending more than 30% of income on housing, a measure of affordability, is lower in Knightdale than in the county, state, and nation.

### **EDUCATIONRESOURCES**

The Town is served by Wake County Public School System (WCPSS), the State's largest school system and 15th largest in the country. Knightdale is home to six WCPSS schools: four elementary schools and one each middle and high school.

Institutions of higher education within 20 miles include: Wake Tech, NC State, Shaw, William Peace, Saint Augustine's, and Meredith.

# GENERAL**FUND**

The General Fund is the Town's primary operating fund. It accounts for all financial resources of the general government, except for those required to be accounted for in a different fund. These other, smaller funds are used for specific purposes with more Information being found in the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) on the Town's website.



### FUND BALANCE QUICK FACTS FOR FY2020

Fund Balance is the difference between assets and liabilities in a governmental fund. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) provide the hierarchy of constraints placed on how fund balance can be spent. Information on fund balance classifications can be found in the notes of the CAFR.

- At the end of the fiscal year, unassigned fund balance for the General Fund was **\$4,733,905.**
- Town Council policy says the Town should maintain an unassigned fund balance of 25%—four months of general fund expenditures—in cases of unforeseen needs or opportunities in addition to meeting cash flow needs of the Town. The Town has exceeded this with an unassigned fund balance of 30%.
- Any unassigned fund balance over 40% gets transferred to the Town's Capital Reserve Fund to offset costs of future capital projects. No funds were moved in FY2020.

### WHERE DOES THE FUNDING COME FROM? **REVENUES** \$15,098,605

Property taxes are the single largest source of revenue for the Town of Knightdale consistent with all other municipalities and counties in North Carolina. The Town also shares in a portion of sales taxes collected and remitted to the NC Department of Revenue by retailers and others. While the State retains the majority of collected sales taxes, portions are allocated back to local governments according to state statutes. To mitigate the overall impact on citizens, where possible the Town charges specific end users for the costs of services. These amounts are reflected in the Sales & Services and Permits & Fees categories. Recreational programming, trash pickup, and building permit fees are examples of these types of revenues.

### WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? EXPENDITURES \$15,352,653

While expenditures can be broken out by function as seen on the right, amounts can also be viewed by type. Of the total General Fund amount expended in fiscal year 2020, **\$7,530,575** or 49% of the total was spent on personnel services. This includes salary and benefits for full-time employees and limited service staff. Operating costs totaling **\$4,814,127** or 31% was the next largest amount. These costs include utilities, fuel, general maintenance, and any other expense necessary for providing routine services to residents. The Town spent **\$1,489,428** or 10% of total on capital items, which includes vehicles and large equipment. Debt service accounts for 10% or **\$1,518,523** of the remaining amount.







### PROPERTY**TAXES**

For the Town to provide the many types of services for citizens, it needs to generate revenue. The main source of revenue is Ad Valorem (property) tax. Property taxes make up **54%** of the General Fund revenues of the Town and are assessed and collected for things such as real estate, business and personal property, and motor vehicles. To equitably tax citizens, the Town relies on the Wake County Tax Department to review ownership and condition of taxable property as of January 1st of each year. A tax rate is set per \$100 assessed value. The total assessed value of property for Knight-dale in 2020 was **\$1,880,526,047**. The Town's **property tax collection rate** was **99.62%** for 2020.

# GOVERNMENT-WIDE STATEMENTS

The government-wide financial statements look at the Town of Knightdale as a single, integrated unit and use the full-accrual basis of accounting. These statements are designed to provide readers with a broad overview of the Town's finances in a manner similar to a private sector business (balance sheet and income statement). They provide short and long-term information about the Town's financial status as a whole and can be found on Exhibits 1 and 2 of the CAFR. Information presented includes only governmental activities. The Town has some business-type activities, but these relate to a water-sewer merger with the City of Raleigh and are fully reimbursable by Raleigh.

#### Balance Sheet

This information provides a snapshot of what the Town owns (its assets) and owes (its liabilities). Net Position represents the Town's investment in the assets it uses in providing services to its citizens.

### Income Statement

This report provides a summary of amounts received (revenues) and amounts spent (expenses). The difference between revenues and expenses shows in the Town's net position. A positive change indicates the Town had enough revenues to cover its obligations and has the ability to save for the future.

# Over time increases and decreases in net position may serve as a useful indicator of whether the financial position is improving or weakening. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the net position increased **\$6,596,541**.

Over 99% of the Town's net position is capital infrastructure representing land, streets, buildings, vehicles and other major equipment that the Town uses to provide services to its citizen.

### OUTSTANDINGDEBT

The Town of Knightdale sometimes issues debt to fund its general governmental and business-type capital needs. The total outstanding debt as of June 30, 2020 totals **\$12,328,869**. This is an increase of 7.5% from the prior year. The Town has a formal policy which provides guidance and direction when considering the impact of debt and actively monitors and manages its debt capacity and affordability. The Town is operating within the parameters of its policy.

The total amount expended—principal and interest—on debt service in FY2020 was \$1,518,523.

General Obligation Bonds are backed by the full faith, credit and taxing power of Knightdale. The collateral for installment purchase agreements are the assets purchased or constructed.

### **ISSUANCEOFDEBT**

The Town's total debt increased by **\$2,247,789** during the 2020 fiscal year. Along with retiring a significant amount of debt during the year, the Town issued the following installment debt:

\$2,000,000—Construction of Wake Stone Athletic Park, February 2020, 10-year term, 2.29%

\$247,789—Purchase of two Public Works trucks, October 2019, 5-year term, 2.2%

The Town approved but did not issue by fiscal yearend \$1,080,000 of installment debt for the purchase of a new Fire ladder truck.



# **GENERALGOVERNMENT**

General Government is the administrative function of the Town of Knightdale. These departments provide the necessary financial and human capital infrastructure to ensure Town services are carried out. Primary is the Administration Department led by the Town Manager, who is responsible for all municipal functions and ensures the Town operates in compliance with federal, state, and local regulations. General Government expenditures represented 19% of the General Fund budget in FY2020 or **\$2,866,030**, of which **\$1,508,086** was for personnel costs, **\$316,241** spent on capital, and the balance of **\$865,913** used for operations and maintenance costs.

### **STRATEGIC**PLANNING



### **PUBLIC**SAFETY**FIRE**

The Knightdale Fire Department is responsible for protecting the lives, property, and the environment of the citizens and visitors to the Town of Knightdale. The department responds to calls of service out of two stations with 13 full-time positions per shift and 42 limited service employees. It currently has four engines, a ladder truck, and a utility truck. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the Fire Department spent **\$1,653,121**, of which **\$1,284,880** was for personnel services, **\$43,917** for capital items and **\$322,844** for operations and maintenance. The Department is currently evaluating its capital needs to ensure sufficient services to the Town's growing needs.

### Town Merges with Eastern Wake Fire Department

On July 1, 2020, Knightdale entered into a service agreement with Wake County to provide fire protection services for the unincorporated areas previously serviced by the Eastern Wake Fire Department. This in effect consolidated the non-profit volunteer fire department with Town operations. The Eastern Wake personnel were added to staff rolls on July 1 and are not reflected on the employee count for fiscal year 2020. Funding for the additional fire services is provided by Wake County using a countywide fire district property tax charged to citizens living in the County's unincorporated areas. The amount of funding to be received by the Town in fiscal year 2021 is **\$1,850,453**. In subsequent years, funding will be determined by a cost-share formula whereby the Town shall received 49.91% of total fire operating costs.


### **PUBLIC**SAFETY**POLICE**

The Police Department seeks to serve by ensuring the safety and security of all who live, work and visit the Town of Knightdale. It does this through its professional policing and community partnerships and an adherence to its Core Values known as PRIDE: Professionalism, Respect, Integrity, Dedication and Ethical Conduct. This is the largest department of the Town with two Police Stations, 35 Patrol units and a K-9 unit. In fiscal year 2020, the Town spent **\$3,885,516** for police services, of which **\$2,953,610** was for personnel services, **\$538,179** was for operations and maintenance, and **\$393,727** was for capital items like vehicles and equipment.

### **Forging Strong Community Partnerships**

The mission of the Knightdale Police Department (KPD) focuses on incorporating professional policing practices and forging strong community partnerships. Throughout 2020, the value of such proved priceless. In the midst of social unrest and a global pandemic, the KPD worked collaboratively with its elected officials and community members to facilitate productive dialogue about the nature of community policing. Those conversations were necessary to further strengthen the mutual respect and trust during a period of uncertainty and change. The KPD believes that a foundational commitment to values-based policing is the most effective way to lead into the future. Policing is a business. Like any business, the police department is growing and adapting to its customers' needs. But unlike most businesses, a police department does not generate profit. It generates trust. What profit is to a business, trust is to a police agency. It is a philosophy that will remain at the core of KPD's mission for years to come.





### **DEVELOPMENT**SERVICES

The Development Services Department facilitates sustainable growth through regulations that promote a balance of the built and natural environments. It is the central point of contact for the Town for all development-related needs and oversees the entire development process from permit application submittals through the issuance of certificates of occupancy (CO). This department ensures that all development activities are conducted in accordance with the Knightdale Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) and North Carolina Building Code. Annual expenditures were **\$730,098**, split **\$522,550** for personnel, **\$122,527** for operations, and **\$85,021** for capital.

### **Development Services Department Initiatives and Accolades for 2020**



• The Town was awarded the Great Main Street Award from the NC Chapter of the American Planning Association for revitalization efforts associated with North First Avenue and Knightdale Station Park.

• Work began on the implementation of a Knightdale Plans and Permit online portal via an IDT platform. This streamlines the application process for all Development Services-related projects and allows for real-time updates to clients and expedites the plan review process. This implements fully in 2021 resulting in better service for all stakeholders.

• The Development Service Department team took the lead on updating the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO). This year-long effort to coordinate the UDO with the recently approved Knightdale Next Comprehensive Plan was a group effort between Town departments, Town Council, Land Use Review Board, and UDO Advisory Committee. Anticipated adoption is expected in June 2021.

### **PUBLIC**WORKS

The Public Works Department operates and maintains existing public infrastructure, plans and constructs capital improvements, and protects public health and safety and natural resources. In fiscal year 2020, it had **\$2,343,580** in annual operating costs. Of this amount, **\$1,110,034** was spent on Operations, **\$703,257** was used for the upkeep of grounds and buildings, and **\$530,289** was spent on streets and sidewalks. Like all NC municipalities, the Town receives funds from the State primarily for street resurfacing, but it can also be used for construction and maintenance of roads, bridges, sidewalks, and greenways. The Town received **\$784,758** in fiscal year 2020.

### **Town Storm Water Operation**

To ensure fresh water for the community, the Town of Knightdale is designated as a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Phase II Storm Water Community and is regulated by both Federal and State governments. The Town manages operational and capital expenditures in a separate storm water fund. These costs are funded by a user fee set by Town Council and reviewed on an annual basis. In fiscal year 2020, the Town collected **\$641,129** in user fee revenue with total funding from all sources being **\$818,841**. Total expenditures for the same time period was **\$721,891**. Reserves for this fund at yearend were **\$991,981**.

The Town is working on a sustainability project whereby storm water needs are addressed in both the short and long terms. This includes a 10-year capital improvement plan. Current capital improvements are being addressed at the Wake Stone Athletic Park, Environment Park, and Harper Park.





### PARKSRECREATION&CULTURE

The mission of the Town's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Programs Department is to enhance the quality of life for citizens of all ages by providing an experienced staff to plan, implement, and manage a wide variety of passive, active and cultural opportunities. Department expenditures for fiscal year 2020 were \$1,265,542, with \$589,619 spent on personnel costs, \$539,822 used for operations and \$136,101 spent on capital-related items. Programming cost were offset by \$206,383 in recreation and service fees. This department was most severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic with expenditures in 2020 being half the amount they were in 2019.

#### **MAJOR**CAPITALINITIATIVES

**Splash Pad**—\$800 thousand for a water play feature at Knightdale Station Park offset by \$330 thousand federal CDBG funding. The project was completed in August 2019.

**Wake Stone Athletic Park**—Council-approved project ordinance of \$4.5 million for Phase I soccer complex partially funded by \$1.0 million Wake County Hospitality Grant. The project is anticipated to be complete in 2021.

**Mingo Creek Greenway Extension**—Council-approved \$2.6 million project ordinance with \$2.1 million coming from a Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) grant. The project has an estimated completion date of 2023.


