TOWNCOUNCIL

The Town of Knightdale has a Council-Manager form of government. Under this system the citizens elect a mayor and five council members as the Town's governing body. The Council then appoints the Town Manager who serves at the discretion of the Council. Council members are elected to four-year terms. The Mayor, as the principal elected official of the town, provides leadership to the governing body and the community, and presides over council meetings.

ABOUTKNIGHTDALE


Incorporated in 1927, the Town of Knightdale is located in Wake County, just seven miles east of Raleigh, the State Capital of North Carolina. It has a corporate limit comprised of 8.54 square miles and an extraterritorial jurisdiction of 16.65 square miles. With a population of only 243 in the 1930 Census, the Town's major growth started in the 1990s, and today, it is recognized as one of the fastest growing municipalities in Wake County, the State's second largest county.

Knightdale is a dynamic community full of opportunity, welcoming those who want something different. It is a place citizens can call their own, where the culture is decided by the people, and a place that encourages its citizens to make the Town what they want and gives them the freedom to be themselves.

The Town's tag line, "Start Something," is more than a motto. It is a mindset, not only for citizens, businesses, and community partners, but for the Town itself. In March 2024, the Town completed construction of a new fire station along the Hodge Road corridor, Fire Station No. 4. The new fire station, spanning approximately 10,000 square feet, was built at a cost of about \$6.6 million. Thirty percent of the project's cost was funded by Wake County through a cost share agreement. Station No. 4 is the first of three major public safety facility projects that the Town is in the process of building. With the addition of this state-of-the-art station, the Town will be able to provide emergency services to the western part of the Town more quickly and efficiently, resulting in improved outcomes for the citizens. Construction of the Forestville Road Fire Station (Station No. 1) began in fiscal year 2023 and is expected to be completed by October 2024. The law enforcement center is currently in the design phase, with construction set to start in fiscal year 2025. These projects are just a few exciting developments underway as Knightdale continues to grow as a vibrant place to live, work and play.

GROWINGECONOMY

The Town of Knightdale's diverse economy is supported by businesses of all shapes and sizes from locally-owned shops to nationally recognized corporations. Its economy benefits from the proximity to the City of Raleigh and the Research Triangle Park, which includes Raleigh, Durham, Chapel Hill and surrounding communities. 
ECONOMICSUMMARY

In fiscal year 2024, the Town's tax base has continued to grow. The number of building permits issued increased by 40% in the last calendar year, bringing a total of 144 million in assessed property value into the Town. Of the 144 million, 61% is related to commercial development. This positive trend has brought new jobs to the area. Knightdale is a wonderful place to live, raise a family, work, and establish a business. In addition to providing a highly desirable quality of life for every type of business and its workforce, Knightdale is an excellent marketplace for businesses and entrepreneurs to offer goods and services of all descriptions.

EDUCATIONRESOURCES

The Town is served by Wake County Public School System (WCPSS), the State's largest school system and 15th largest in the country. Knightdale is home to six WCPSS schools: four elementary schools and one each middle and high school.

Institutions of higher education within 20 miles include: Wake Technical Community College, North Carolina State University, Shaw University, William Peace University, Saint Augustine's University, and Meredith College.

GENERALFUND

The General Fund is the Town's primary operating fund. It accounts for all financial resources of the general government, except for those required to be accounted for in a different fund. These other, smaller funds are used for specific purposes with more Information being found in the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) on the Town's website.

FUND BALANCE QUICK FACTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024

Fund Balance is the difference between assets and liabilities in a governmental fund. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) provide the hierarchy of constraints placed on how fund balance can be spent. Information on fund balance classifications can be found in the notes of the ACFR.

At the end of the fiscal year, the total fund balance for the General Fund was **\$14,639,473**. The unassigned fund balance was **\$8,782,655**.

Town Council policy says the Town should maintain an unassigned fund balance of 25% - three months of general fund expenditures - in cases of unforeseen needs or opportunities in addition to meeting cash flow needs of the Town. The Town has exceeded this with an unassigned fund balance of 32.3%.


WHERE DOES THE FUNDING COME FROM? REVENUES \$27,703,998

Property taxes are the single largest source of revenue for the Town of Knightdale consistent with all other municipalities and counties in North Carolina. The Town also shares in a portion of sales taxes collected and remitted to the NC Department of Revenue by retailers and others. While the State retains the majority of collected sales taxes, portions are allocated back to local governments according to state statutes. To mitigate the overall impact on citizens, where possible the Town charges specific end users for the costs of services. These amounts are reflected in the Sales & Services and Permits & Fees categories. Recreational programming, trash pickup, and building permit fees are examples of these types of revenues.

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? EXPENDITURES \$26,725,028


While expenditures can be broken out by function as seen on the right, amounts can also be viewed by type. Of the total General Fund amount expended in fiscal year 2024, **\$14,553,356** or 54% of the total was spent on personnel services. This includes salary and benefits for full-time employees and limited service staff. Operating costs totaling **\$6,800,770** or 25% was the next largest amount. These costs include utilities, fuel, general maintenance, and any other expense necessary for providing routine services to residents. The Town spent **\$2,487,662** or 9% of total on capital items, which includes vehicles and large equipment. Debt service accounts for 11% or **\$2,883,240** of the remaining amount.



PROPERTYTAXES

For the Town to provide the many types of services for citizens, it needs to generate revenue. The main source of revenue is Ad Valorem (property) tax. Property taxes make up **45%** of the General Fund revenues of the Town and are assessed and collected for things such as real estate, business and personal property, and motor vehicles. To equitably tax citizens, the Town relies on the Wake County Tax Department to review ownership and condition of taxable property as of January 1st of each year. A tax rate is set per \$100 assessed value. The total assessed value of property for Knight-dale in 2024 was **\$2,740,601,556.** The Town's **property tax collection rate** was **99.68%** for 2024.

Balance Sheet

Income Statement

This report provides a summary of amounts received (revenues) and amounts spent (expenses). The difference between revenues and expenses shows in the Town's net position. A positive change indicates the Town had enough revenues to cover its obligations and has the ability to save for the future.

Over time increases and decreases in net position may serve as a useful indicator of whether the financial position is improving or weakening. For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024, the net position increased \$6,033,795 or 4.74% from the previous year.

Over 90% of the Town's net position is capital infrastructure representing land, streets, buildings, vehicles and other major equipment that the Town uses to provide services to its citizen.



CAPITAL ASSETS—NET OF DEPRECIATION (in millions)




OUTSTANDINGDEBT

The Town of Knightdale issues debt to fund its general governmental capital needs. The total outstanding debt as of June 30, 2024, totals **\$18,508,261**. This is a **decrease of \$1,795,604** or 8.8% from the prior year. The Town's policy, which provides guidance and direction when considering the impact of debt, is debt service expenditures shall not exceed 15% of the total General Fund Budget. The Town is operating within the parameters of this policy. The total amount spent—principal and interest—on debt service in fiscal year 2024 was **\$2,883,240**. This is an **increase of \$1,102,200** or 62% from the prior year.

Outstanding Debt



General Obligation Bonds are backed by the full faith, credit, and taxing power of Knightdale. The collateral for installment purchase agreements are the assets purchased or constructed. Leases are defined as contracts that convey control of the right to use another entity's nonfinancial asset (the underlying asset) as specified in the contract for a period of time in an exchange or exchange-like transaction. Subscription Based Information Technology Agreements provide governments with access to vendors' IT software and associated tangible capital assets for subscription payments without granting governments perpetual license or title to the IT software and associated tangible capital assets.

GENERALGOVERNMENT

General Government is the administrative function of the Town of Knightdale. These departments provide the necessary financial and human capital infrastructure to ensure Town services are carried out. Primary is the Administration Department led by the Town Manager, who is responsible for all municipal functions and ensures the Town operates in compliance with federal, state, and local regulations. General Government expenditures represented 13% of the General Fund budget in fiscal year 2024 or **\$3,491,090**, of which **\$2,105,555** was for personnel costs, **\$137,799** spent on capital, and the balance of **\$1,247,736** used for operations and maintenance costs.

The Town of Knightdale partners with Habitat for Humanity Wake County

This joint effort addresses the critical need for affordable housing while fostering a sense of unity and shared purpose within our community. Through our dedicated team of volunteers and Habitat for Humanity Wake County's expertise, we are dedicated to constructing safe, beautiful, affordable homes that will serve as a foundation for brighter futures. Habitat for Humanity Wake County's mission aligns seamlessly with our values, making this partnership a significant step towards creating a positive impact in Knightdale.





PUBLICSAFETY**FIRE**

The Knightdale Fire Department is responsible for protecting the lives, property, and the environment of the citizens and visitors to the Town of Knightdale. The department responds to calls for service out of four stations with over 50 full-time positions. For the fiscal year 2024, the Fire Department spent **\$6,263,721** of which **\$5,271,928** was for personnel services, **\$175,293** spent on capital and **\$816,500** for operations and maintenance. Fire services extend outside of Town limits; and therefore, the Town participates in the County's Fire Cost-Share program. In fiscal year 2024, the Town **received funding of \$2,905,163** from the County.

New Fire Engines Enhance Knightdale's Safety Commitment

The Town's Fire Department received two new Pierce Enforcers engines in fiscal year 2024. As Knightdale transforms into a more urban community, these smaller vehicles will provide more effective and efficient maneuverability. They carry 750 gallons of water with a 1500 GPM pump. The new engines are also equipped with Idle Reduction Technology, which offers many benefits, including fuel savings and reductions in pollution, greenhouse gas emission, noise, and engine wear. They are also equipped with all of the firefighting, EMS, and rescue equipment needed for emergencies.

PUBLICSAFETY**POLICE**

The Police Department seeks to serve by ensuring the safety and security of all who live, work and visit the Town of Knightdale. It does this through its professional policing and community partnerships and an adherence to its Core Values known as PRIDE: Professionalism, Respect, Integrity, Dedication and Ethical Conduct. The KPD is comprised of three separate divisions (Administration, Patrol, and Support Services) made up of 54 sworn and non-sworn personnel. In fiscal year 2024, the Town spent **\$6,172,942** for police services, of which **\$4,210,393** was for personnel services, **\$1,006,009** was for capital, and **\$956,540** was for operations and maintenance.

Knightdale Police Department Awarded CALEA Accreditation

In March 2024, The CALEA Commission voted unanimously to award Knightdale Police Department Advanced Law Enforcement Accreditation status. This marks the third time Knightdale Police Department has been recognized for its adherence to high professional standards and law enforcement best practices. The Commission made favorable re-



marks in several areas. Specifically, they commented on the work being done with the Cadet Program, our emphasis on career development, and the impressive relationship KPD maintains with the community. Most importantly, the commissioners touted KPD as one of the most resilient agencies it has encountered.

DEVELOPMENTSERVICES

The Development Services Department facilitates sustainable growth through regulations that promote a balance of the built and natural environments. It is the central point of contact for the Town for all development-related needs and oversees the entire development process from permit application submittals through the issuance of certificates of occupancy (CO). This department ensures that all development activities are conducted in accordance with the Knightdale Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) and North Carolina Building Code. Annual expenditures were **\$2,072,656** of which **\$1,167,729** was for personnel, **\$594,485** was for capital, and **\$310,442** was for operations and maintenance.

Affordable Knightdale Plan

In March 2024, Town Council unanimously voted to adopt the Affordable Knightdale Plan. Affordable Knightdale puts forward a path that will aid in the realization of the Town's vision for an inclusive, livable, and affordable future. With the guidance and expertise of UNC-Greensboro's Center for Housing & Com-



munity Studies, and action-oriented plan was developed that not only prioritizes affordable housing, but emphasizes the importance of inclusive and equitable growth.

Community engagement was a key component in the planning process. Various opportunities were provided for Knightdale residents, workers, business owners, leaders, and stakeholders to provide thoughts and feedback on the plan.

PUBLICWORKS

The Public Works Department maintains existing public infrastructure, plans and constructs capital improvements, and protects public health and safety and natural resources. In fiscal year 2024, it had **\$2,646,044** in annual operating costs. Of this amount, **\$1,381,814** was spent on general operations, **\$814,740** was used for the upkeep of grounds and buildings, and **\$449,490** was spent on streets and sidewalks. Like all NC municipalities, the Town receives funds from the State primarily for street resurfacing, but it can also be used for construction and maintenance of roads, bridges, sidewalks, and greenways. The Town had **\$1,488,678** available at year end.

Knightdale Celebrates 2024 Creek Week and Storywalk

Knightdale's Creek Week is a collaboration between the Town, NC Clean Water Education Partnership, and Wake County Public Libraries. This year's StoryWalk highlights the book "Water Is Water: A Book About the Water Cycle," by Miranda Paul. Creek Week is hosted regionally by the Clean Water Education Partnership (CWEP).

"Creek Week and our annual StoryWalk provide a platform for the community to engage with their surrounding environment," said Ike Archer, Stormwater Program Manager for the Town of Knightdale. "These events help promote and



strengthen the connection between our community and their local water resources, with the hopes of fostering a legacy of environmental stewardship here in Knightdale."



PARKSRECREATION&CULTURE

The mission of the Town's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Programs Department is to enhance the quality of life for citizens of all ages by providing an experienced staff to plan, implement, and manage a wide variety of passive, active and cultural opportunities. Department expenditures for fiscal year 2024 were **\$1,882,552**, with **\$737,965** spent on personnel costs, **\$781,776** used for operations and **\$362,811** spent on capital related items. Programming costs were offset by **\$260,036** in recreation and service fees.

MINGOCREEKGREENWAYEXTENSION

Council approved a construction project for a 1.2 mile extension of the Mingo Creek greenway. The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) is funding \$3.3 million of this project in grants.
