




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# TOWNCOUNCIL

The Council then appoints the Town Manager who serves at the discretion of the Council. Council members are elected to four-year terms. 




# ABOUT **KNIGHTDALE**


Incorporated in 1927, the Town of Knightdale is located in Wake County, just seven miles east of Raleigh, the State Capital of North Carolina. It has a corporate limit comprised of 8.54 square miles and an extraterritorial jurisdiction of 16.65 square miles. With a population of only 243 in the 1930 Census, the Town's major growth started in the 1990s, and today, it is recognized as one of the fastest growing municipalities in Wake County, the State's largest county.

Knightdale is a dynamic community full of opportunity, welcoming those who want something different. It is a place citizens can call their own, where the culture is decided by the people, and a place that encourages its citizens to make the Town what they want and gives them the freedom to be themselves.

The Town's tag line, "Start Something," is more than a motto. It is a mindset, not only for citizens, businesses, and community partners, but for the Town itself. In October 2024, the Town opened the Forestville Road Fire Station as the newest fire station in Knightdale. This 13,500 square foot fire station boasts state-of-the-art infrastructure, incorporating advanced firefighting equipment and cutting-edge technology to enhance response capabilities. The Town is currently in the process of constructing a new Law Enforcement Center. Construction for this project began in March 2025, and will be completed in two phases. The first phase includes renovations and expansion of the current public safety complex. Knightdale Police Department operations will move into the newly renovated space around Spring 2026. Phase two will involve the completion of Fire Administrative offices, which is anticipated to happen in Fall 2026. The end result will be an approximately 31,000 square feet state-of-the-art law enforcement center. The Town is also exploring the possibility of constructing a Community Center. This facility would support recreational, educational, and social needs of the community. Potential amenities include indoor recreational courts, space for group fitness classes, and areas for the arts. These projects are just a few exciting developments underway as Knightdale continues to grow as a vibrant place to live, work, and play.

## GROWING ECONOMY

The Town of Knightdale's diverse economy is supported by businesses of all shapes and sizes from locally-owned shops to nationally recognized corporations. Its economy benefits from the proximity to the City of Raleigh and the Research Triangle Park, which includes Raleigh, Durham, Chapel Hill and surrounding communities. This area is considered one of the best places to live and work in the United States. Unemployment rate for this area is 3.4%, which is lower than the statewide rate of 4.0% and the national rate of 4.4% .

# ECONOMIC SUMMARY

In fiscal year 2025, the Town's tax base has continued to grow. The number of building permits issued increased by 82% in the last calendar year, bringing a total of \$163 million in assessed property value into the Town. Of the 163 million, 23% is related to commercial development. This positive trend has brought new jobs to the area. Knightdale is a wonderful place to live, raise a family, work, and establish a business. In addition to providing a highly desirable quality of life for every type of business and its workforce, Knightdale is an excellent marketplace for businesses and entrepreneurs to offer goods and services of all descriptions.

## EDUCATION RESOURCES

The Town is served by Wake County Public School System (WCPSS), the State's largest school system and 15th largest in the country. Knightdale is home to six WCPSS schools: four elementary schools and one each middle and high school.

Institutions of higher education within 20 miles include: Wake Technical Community College, North Carolina State University, Shaw University, William Peace University, Saint Augustine's University, and Meredith College.

# GENERAL FUND

The General Fund is the Town’s primary operating fund. It accounts for all financial resources of the general government, except for those required to be accounted for in a different fund. These other, smaller funds are used for specific purposes with more information being found in the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) on the Town’s website.

## FUND BALANCE QUICK FACTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025

Fund Balance is the difference between assets and liabilities in a governmental fund. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) provide the hierarchy of constraints placed on how fund balance can be spent. Information on fund balance classifications can be found in the notes of the ACFR.

At the end of the fiscal year, the total fund balance for the General Fund was **\$16,568,068**. The unassigned fund balance was **\$10,873,735**.

Town Council policy says the Town should maintain an unassigned fund balance of 25% - three months of general fund expenditures - in cases of unforeseen needs or opportunities in addition to meeting cash flow needs of the Town. The Town has exceeded this with an unassigned fund balance of 30.8%.

# REVENUES

**\$37,293,405**

Property taxes are the single largest source of revenue for the Town of Knightdale consistent with all other municipalities and counties in North Carolina. The Town also shares in a portion of sales taxes collected and remitted to the NC Department of Revenue by retailers and others. While the State retains the majority of collected sales taxes, portions are allocated back to local governments according to state statutes. To mitigate the overall impact on citizens, where possible the Town charges specific end users for the costs of services. These amounts are reflected in the Sales & Services and Permits & Fees categories. Recreational programming, trash pickup, and building permit fees are examples of these types of revenues.



# EXPENDITURES

**\$35,364,810**

While expenditures can be broken out by function as seen on the right, amounts can also be viewed by type. Of the total General Fund amount expended in fiscal year 2025, **\$16,800,236** or 48% of the total was spent on personnel services. This includes salary and benefits for full-time employees and limited service staff. Operating costs totaling **\$8,796,804** or 25% was the next largest amount. These costs include utilities, fuel, general maintenance, and any other expense necessary for providing routine services to residents. The Town spent **\$2,537,115** or 7% of total on capital items, which includes vehicles and large equipment. Transfers to other funds total **\$3,669,151** or 10%. Debt service accounts for 10% or **\$3,561,505**.



# PROPERTY TAXES

For the Town to provide the many types of services for citizens, it needs to generate revenue. The main source of revenue is Ad Valorem (property) tax. Property taxes make up **51%** of the General Fund revenues of the Town and are assessed and collected for things such as real estate, business and personal property, and motor vehicles. To equitably tax citizens, the Town relies on the Wake County Tax Department to review ownership and condition of taxable property as of January 1st of each year. A tax rate is set per \$100 assessed value. The total assessed value of property for Knightdale in 2025 was **\$4,300,036,807**. The Town's **property tax collection rate** was **99.62%** for 2025.

# OUTSTANDING DEBT

The Town of Knightdale issues debt to fund its general governmental capital needs. The total outstanding debt as of June 30, 2025, totals **\$29,888,115**. This is an **increase of \$11,379,854** or **62%** from the prior year. The Town’s policy, which provides guidance and direction when considering the impact of debt, is debt service expenditures shall not exceed 15% of the total General Fund Budget. The Town is operating within the parameters of this policy at **8%**. The total amount spent—principal and interest—on debt service in fiscal year 2025 was **\$3,561,505**.

## Outstanding Debt



**General Obligation Bonds** are backed by the full faith, credit, and taxing power of Knightdale. **Limited Obligation Bonds** are NOT backed by taxing power of Knightdale, instead they are backed by specific, limited sources of revenue or the underlying asset(s). The collateral for **installment purchase agreements** are the assets purchased or constructed. **Leases** are defined as contracts that convey control of the right to use another entity’s nonfinancial asset (the underlying asset) as specified in the contract for a period of time in an exchange or exchange-like transaction. **Subscription Based Information Technology Agreements** provide governments with access to vendors’ IT software and associated tangible capital assets for subscription payments without granting governments perpetual license or title to the IT software and associated tangible capital assets.

# GENERAL GOVERNMENT

General Government is the administrative function of the Town of Knightdale. These departments provide the necessary financial and human capital infrastructure to ensure Town services are carried out. Primary is the Administration Department led by the Town Manager, who is responsible for all municipal functions and ensures the Town operates in compliance with federal, state, and local regulations. General Government expenditures represented **12%** of the General Fund budget in fiscal year 2025 or **\$4,147,226**, of which **\$2,480,377** was for personnel costs, **\$193,815** spent on capital, and the balance of **\$1,473,034** used for operations and maintenance costs.

## Human Resources and Finance Departments Relocated to the Lofts at Knightdale Station

On October 1, 2025, the Human Resources and Finance Departments relocated from Town Hall to the Lofts at Knightdale Station. These departments may have changed locations, but you can still expect the same great customer service you've already received. This new location features a payment drop box outside of the Finance Department that is available for use during and after hours. Payments are retrieved from the drop box each business day. The address for the new location is 305 Sugar Magnolia Lane, Suite 105 (Finance) and Suite 305 (Human Resources).





# PUBLIC SAFETY

The Public Safety function is comprised of the Fire and Police Departments. The Fire Department is responsible for protecting the lives, property, and the environment of the citizens and visitors to the Town of Knightdale. The department responds to calls for service out of four stations with over 50 full-time positions.

The Police Department seeks to serve by ensuring the safety and security of all who live, work and visit the Town of Knightdale. It does this through its professional policing and community partnerships and an adherence to its Core Values known as PRIDE: Professionalism, Respect, Integrity, Dedication and Ethical Conduct. The KPD is comprised of three separate divisions (Administration, Patrol, and Support Services) made up of over 50 sworn and non-sworn personnel. For fiscal year 2025, Public Safety spent **\$13,874,449** of which **\$10,984,441** was for personnel services, **\$713,641** spent on capital and **\$2,176,367** for operations and maintenance. Fire services extend outside of Town limits; and therefore, the Town participates in the County's Fire Cost-Share program. In fiscal year 2025, the Town **received funding of \$4,002,887** from the County.

# ECONOMIC & PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

The Economic and Physical Development function is comprised of the Development Services and Community Relations departments. Development Services facilitates sustainable growth through regulations that promote a balance of the built and natural environments, and makes up most of the expenditures in the Economic and Physical Development function. It is the central point of contact for the Town for all development-related needs and oversees the entire development process from permit application submittals through the issuance of certificates of occupancy (CO). This department ensures that all development activities are conducted in accordance with the Knightdale Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) and North Carolina Building Code.

The Community Relations department strives to foster a culture of engagement where residents, businesses, and organizations are active partners in shaping the future of Knightdale. Community Relations also serves as the primary contact for all communication and marketing activities for the Town.

Together this function's annual expenditures were **\$2,135,269** of which **\$1,312,348** was for personnel, **\$189,823** was for capital, and **\$633,098** was for operations and maintenance.

### **Knightdale Commerce Alliance**

The Community Relations department launched the Knightdale Commerce Alliance (KCA) to support and strengthen the local business community. KCA serves as a resource hub for registered businesses, providing support, fostering collaboration, and promoting economic growth. The Town launched an official online business directory with 250+ registrants and the K-Commerce Chronicle, a monthly newsletter that keeps businesses informed about programs, opportunities, and initiatives offered by the Town.

# PUBLICWORKS


The Public Works Department maintains existing public infrastructure, plans and constructs capital improvements, and protects public health and safety and natural resources. In fiscal year 2025, expenditures totaled **\$4,182,832**. Of this amount, **\$1,839,960** was spent on general operations, **\$1,161,674** was used for the upkeep of grounds and buildings, and **\$1,181,198** was spent on streets and sidewalks. Like all NC municipalities, the Town receives funds from the State primarily for street resurfacing, but it can also be used for construction and maintenance of roads, bridges, sidewalks, and greenways. The Town had **\$1,479,396** available at year end for future street resurfacing projects.

## Knightsdale Celebrates 2025 Creek Week and Storywalk

Knightsdale's Creek Week is a collaboration between the Town, NC Clean Water Education Partnership, and Wake County Public Libraries. This year's StoryWalk also included an Art Contest to get younger members of the community thinking about the health and wellness of their Town. Creek Week is hosted regionally by the Clean Water Education Partnership (CWEP).

"Creek Week and our annual StoryWalk provide a platform for the community to engage with their surrounding environment," said Ike Archer, Stormwater Program Manager for the Town of Knightsdale. "These events help promote and strengthen the connection between our community and their local water resources, with the hopes of fostering a legacy of environmental stewardship here in Knightsdale."





# PARKS RECREATION & CULTURE

The mission of the Town’s Parks, Recreation and Cultural Programs Department is to enhance the quality of life for citizens of all ages by providing an experienced staff to plan, implement, and manage a wide variety of passive, active and cultural opportunities. Department expenditures for fiscal year 2025 were **\$2,339,517**, with **\$829,341** spent on personnel costs, **\$725,403** used for operations and **\$784,773** spent on capital related items. Programming costs were offset by **\$222,760** in recreation and service fees.

## CROOM PROPERTY DONATION

During fiscal year 2025, the Town was acknowledged as a beneficiary of the Anne Elizabeth Croom estate. As a beneficiary the Town received 32.67 acres of land, \$400,000 to develop and maintain a park, and proceeds from the sale of real property totaling \$816,051. As the Town continues discussion for a future community center, it will likely be constructed on this property.

## AWARDS

*The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA)* has given an Award for Outstanding Achievement in *Popular Annual Financial Reporting (PAFR)* to Knightdale for its Citizens' Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024. This is the sixth such certificate the Town has received. This award is a prestigious national award recognizing conformance with the highest standards for preparation of state and local government popular reports. The award is given to those organizations whose content conforms to program standards for creativity, presentation, understandability, and reader appeal. It is only valid for one year. We believe this year's report continues to conform to the PAFR standards.

In addition, the Town has received the GFOA award for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the *Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR)* for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024. This is the thirty-third (33rd) such certificate the Town has received.


