**O**n November 11th, the Knightdale community gathered for its annual Veterans Day tribute, hosted by the Two Green Thumbs Garden Club and the Town of Knightdale. This year's event was emceed by WRAL's Renee Chou and featured Four-Star General Dan K. McNeill (Retired) as the keynote speaker.

The program this year was special, as it marked the dedication of the Knightdale Veterans Memorial Plaza, with its five monuments honoring each branch of the military. The names of our community members, whose lives were lost in service to our Country, will be inscribed on the monuments. The Plaza is the new home of Knightdale's Blue Star Memorial Marker, honoring all those who serve in the Armed Forces. The dedication culminated with the unveiling of a Gold Star Families Memorial Marker, honoring the families of fallen soldiers. The Knightdale Veterans Memorial is the only memorial in North Carolina to hold both Blue Star and Gold Star Memorial status.

General McNeill spoke about the privilege of serving in the Armed Forces and how that service translates into the liberties we enjoy each day. He said "By what right do we assemble here today to dedicate this beautiful memorial?.... The liberties and latitude of the Constitution of the United States of America grant us the right of peaceful assembly and free expressions of gratitude. Who has the duty to protect that Constitution? All those who serve."

## FORESTVILLE ROAD ATHLETIC COMPLEX



On November 20th, 2018 Wake Stone Corporation finalized a 40 acre donation to the Town of Knightdale. This generous donation is designated for the construction of an athletic complex at the intersection of Forestville Road and Old Crews Road. The Town of Knightdale and the North Carolina Football Club (NCFC) will collaborate to build the complex. The first phase of the project includes five regulation-sized soccer fields and associated amenities. The Wake County Board of Commissioners, through the Hospitality Tax Small Projects Capital Grant Program, awarded the Town of Knightdale a \$1 million grant for this project on May 21, 2018.

"It is exciting to see this vision become a reality after years of working with the Town and other stakeholders to provide additional recreational opportunities for our community," said

Sam Bratton, President of Wake Stone Corporation. "At Wake Stone, we have a long history of serving the communities where we operate, and we are glad that this donation will benefit the residents of Knightdale and the greater Wake County region, for generations to come."

Per Mayor James Roberson, "This project will generate an estimated economic benefit of \$4.4 million annually, bringing an estimated 261,000 visitors to Eastern Wake County." Bob Harris, Director of Operations for NCFC Youth stated, "North Carolina Football Club is excited to partner with Knightdale to provide this opportunity for eastern Wake youth. It's a fantastic location and the facility's size will allow for us to expand many programs, including our college showcase."
